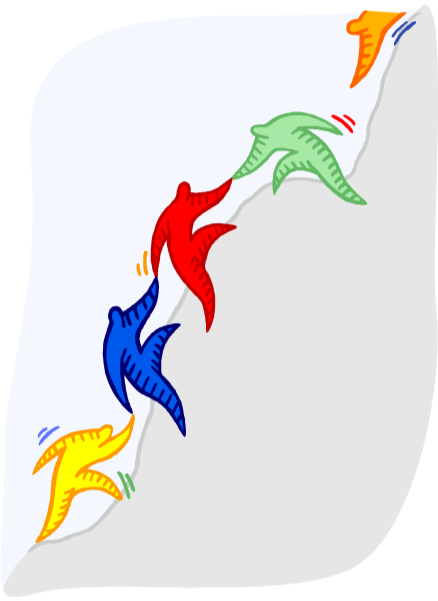

Persons meeting the requirements for the Community Care Services Program may receive in home services, such as; home maker, personal care, home delivered meals, respite care, Assisted Living, and Emergency Response Services.
